SMAP Expo opens in Abu Dhabi

all 2012 Foreign Direct Investment into Morocco went toward the country's burgeoning real estate sector, while the UAE stands as the second largest investor overall on Morocco's international foreign investors list.

Samir El Chammah, CEO of SMAP Group, organisers of SMAP Expo Abu Dhabi, said: "The event is perfect for the 40,000 Moroccan expatriate population living in the UAE, Emiratis and other UAE based resident expatriates looking for a second home or investment opportunity."
